Identification of students:

Criteria: (including parent, student nominations, teacher nominations and a variety of data)

Students are selected on the basis of promise demonstrated in lessons and measured improvement throughout the academic year. The criteria used to identify these students is based upon what the NC (National Curriculum) identifies as the criteria for pupils who are gifted in Geography.

All students working at or above a level 7 at KS3, all students identified as having a median quartile target of an A* at GCSE, and ALIS target of 115 or above for 'AS' or 'A2' level are considered by the department to be our 'No Limits' students.

Parents and students can also nominate a student for consideration.

Review:

'No limits' students are reviewed after each progress check and students who are considered to be developing their work at this level are included on our lists.

Notification:

Learners will be notified by the programme leaders at the beginning of the year, this will also be discussed with parents.

Curriculum opportunities with 'No Limits' :

'No Limits' students have the opportunity to extend their Geographical knowledge and skills through well developed extended pieces of work that are planned into all areas of the curriculum.

Students have access to a well stocked number of Geography texts that can be used to broaden their subject knowledge and extend their learning (this is especially suitable for sixth form students)

Enrichment opportunities with 'No Limits':

Enrichment and curriculum trips take place over the course of the academic year which includes a trip to Cambridge University (available to a selection of yr 9 'No limits' students), trips to Ampthill Park (yr10), to Dorset (yr12) and to London Docklands (yr12) for all students in these year groups.

Over the past two years we have been able to be part of the Luton Regeneration Challenge (yr 10) an excellent opportunity for students to extend their skills and push themselves to develop in areas previously unexplored by them.
