BASIC SOCIAL MEDIA

- **Be careful what you share.**
- **Avoid adding strangers.**
- **Use good netiquette.**

INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDER

- Can set your connection for family
- Can make changes to the router:
 - Internet on a timer
 - Filtering
 - Blocks
- Providers will be able to walk you through the process of changing these settings or in most cases will be able to do this remotely.



FACEBOOK

How Tags Work

- Profile Review** of posts friends tag you in before they go on your profile (note: tags may still appear elsewhere on Facebook) On >
- Tag Review** of tags that friends want to add to your posts On >
- Profile Visibility** of posts you're tagged in once they're on your profile * Custom ▾
- Tag Suggestions** when friends upload photos that look like you Off >
- Friends Can Check You Into Places** using the mobile Places app Off >

Timeline and Tagging

- Who can post on your timeline? Friends ▾
- Who can see what others post on your timeline? Friends of Friends ▾
- Review posts friends tag you in before they appear on your timeline On >
- Who can see posts you've been tagged in on your timeline? Friends of Friends ▾
- Review tags friends add to your own posts on Facebook On >

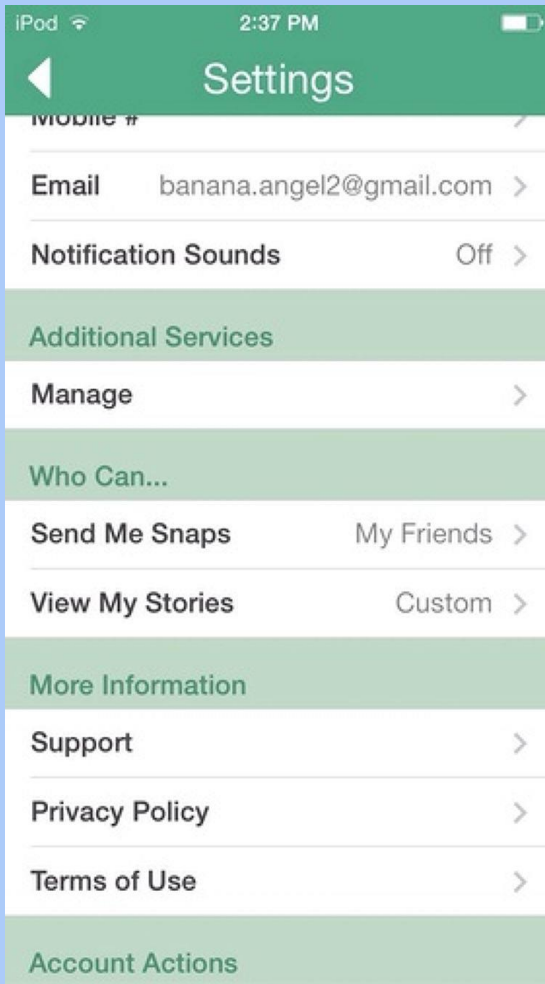
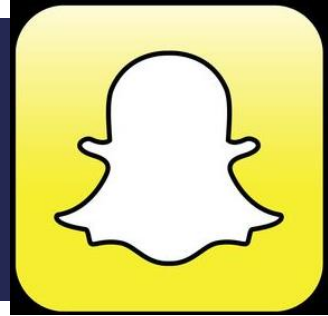

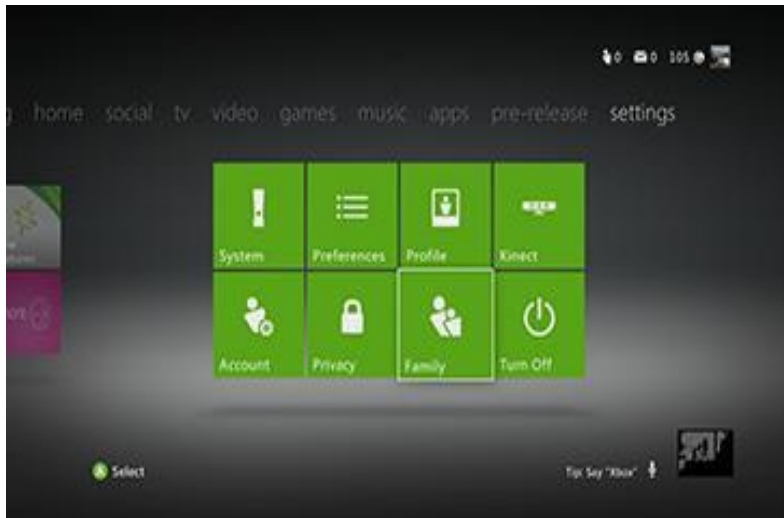

SNAPCHAT



- Make it clear to your teen, nothing goes away on the Internet or is 100% private. One picture taken just for fun today, can come back to haunt them 10 years from now.
- Enforce The Grandma Rule – only send out what you would comfortably share with your grandmother.
- Setup a Snapchat account for yourself. You can check to see how many and who your child send the most “snaps” to through the BFF list.
- Set time limits and check up on Snapchat use. This app isn't to be taken lightly.

GAME CONSOLES/ONLINE GAMING



- Multiplayer games that allow communication between players via microphone or Kinect (Visual)
- Sexual predators targeting multiplayer games – Minecraft, Halo, Call of Duty, Battlefield, GTA, etc.
- Setting up your account on a console will require you to provide your age. Parents should setup a console and set the correct access for all children in the home.
- Consoles need to be set at the appropriate age and have the right settings to avoid children who are under age from playing inappropriate games with questionable content.
- Like all forms of Social media, only choose friends online that you know in the real world.

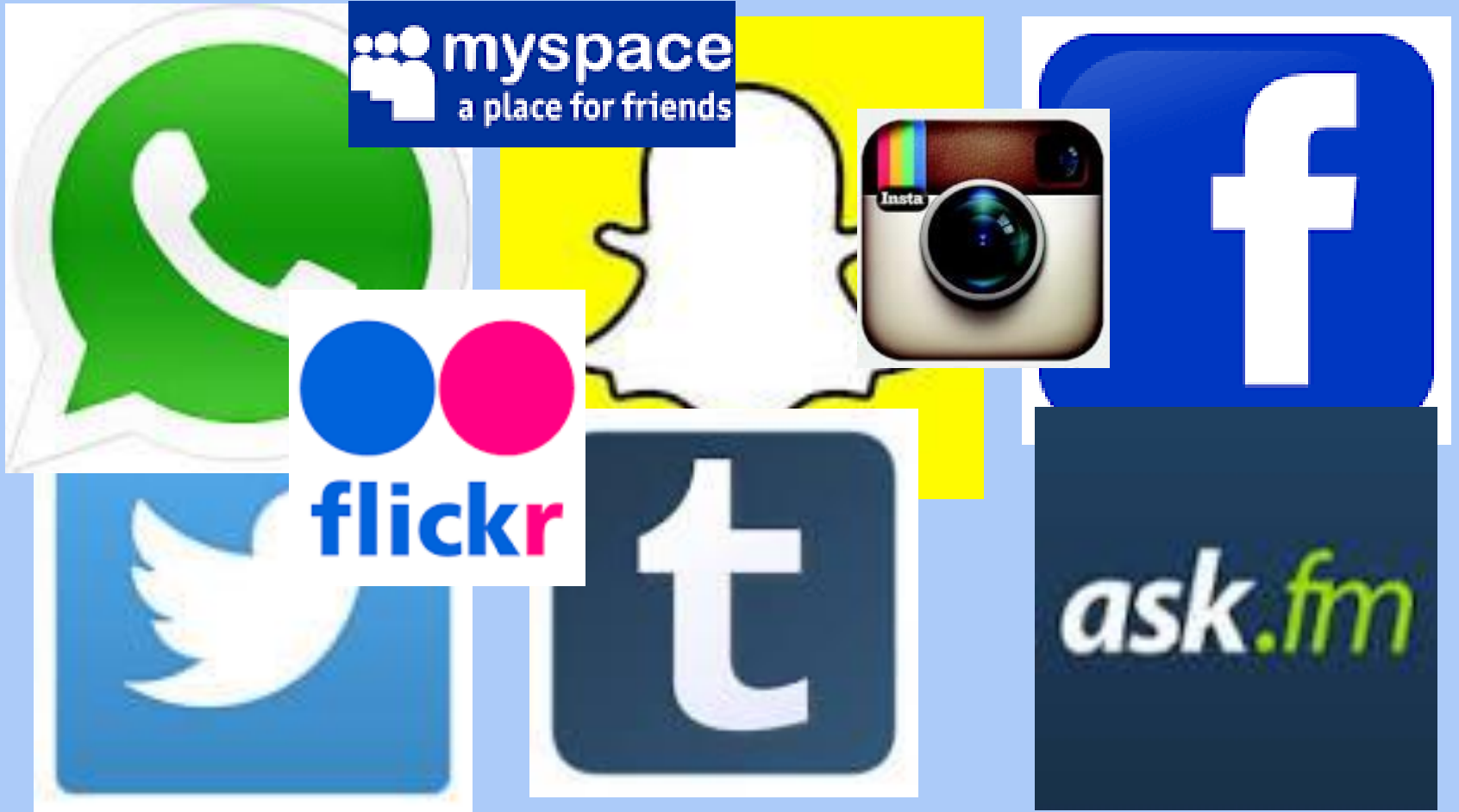

CYBER BULLYING



any form of bullying using technology eg rumours and gossip; abusive comments; ganging up; blackmail; stolen identity; threats

THINK ABOUT WHAT YOU SHARE

- Would you show complete strangers pictures of yourself? Even just family holiday ones?
- Would you go into a park and collect “friends” and “friends of friends”?
- If the bus driver asked you where you live, when your birthday was and where you liked to hang out, would you tell him / her?
- Would you tell all your neighbours the “secret” that your best friend had just told you?
- **If you wouldn't do it face to face, do not do it online**

SEXTING



when someone sends or receives a sexually explicit text, image or video on their mobile phone, usually in a text message

WHY PEOPLE SEXT

- They feel “safe” because they are often in the security of their own home
- They trust the person that they send the picture or video to
- They have been put under pressure to send images
- Because it gives them a bit of a thrill

WHY YOU SHOULDN'T

- You are breaking the law to send any sexualised image of someone under 18 – even if it is you.
- You instantly lose control of that image or video – others can re-post it, screen-shot it and forward it, digitally manipulate it to make it worse, print it
- You run the risk of this image being found in the future if your name was Googled.
- **If you would be embarrassed if your Grandma or Headteacher saw it, never send any sexts to anyone.**

SCHOOL ACTION

- We teach our students how to stay safe and use the technology in a responsible way – in Personal Development lessons; form time; assemblies; 1:1 when the need arises
- We take seriously any concerns regarding E Safety and will investigate and take action to safeguard young people – of Harlington and other schools
- We will inform parents and, where necessary, the police to ensure that students are safe.

HOW TO KEEP YOURSELF SAFE

- Make the necessary changes to your online habits to eradicate the risks to your safety – decision making, privacy settings, reporting
- Don't ever accept any friend request unless you actually know the person. Don't "collect" friends.
- Report any concerns, however embarrassed you may be, to a parent, teacher, police officer or to CEOP.
- CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection) is a police organisation working to keep all children safe when online. Their report abuse button is on Harlington website
