Identification of students:

Students are selected on the basis of promise demonstrated in lessons and measured improvement throughout the academic year.

All students working at or above a level 7 at KS3, or at grades A / A* at GCSE, 'AS' or 'A2' level are considered by the department to be our 'No Limits' students.

Parents and students can also nominate a student for consideration.

Curriculum opportunities with 'No Limits' :

'No limits' students can further extend their philosophical skills through making links with the topic areas they have covered and relating them to issues in society. For example, for students that have studied euthanasia they can appreciate the arguments and controversies surrounding the recent case of Tony Nicklinson. Students have access to a range of book resources that may be loaned to them to broaden their subject knowledge and extend their learning. Extension sessions are also available on request to discuss ethical and philosophical issues.

Enrichment opportunities with 'No Limits':

There are a range of enrichment visits & visitors available to all including a visit to Berlin to see a concentration camp. At GCSE and A level revision and study days are offered. In 2013, planning is taking place to visit Berlin again, in addition to a visit to Beth Shalom in Nottinghamshire.

Extension Activities with 'No Limits':

Students have the opportunity to research ethical issues after studying ethical topics in lessons. There are also a range of websites, films and books that have strong philosophical, religious and ethical links with content in the units studied.
